- Identify potential natural and man-made risk to the organization including: arson, cyber attacks, earthquakes, floods, hurricanes, labor strikes, power outages, terrorism, and workplace violence.

- Develop recovery point objectives, the maximum acceptable loss of business, processes and/or information technology following an unplanned event or disaster.
